

Elam students take top prizes at National Drawing Awards(图)

Elam School of Fine Arts students from the National Institute of Creative Arts and Industries at The University of Auckland have taken top prizes at the National Drawing Award 2006. The biennial competition is hosted by ARTSPACE (Auckland) and The Physics Room (Christchurch), two independent, contemporary public galleries funded by Creative New Zealand. 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For Christina, the drawing was inspired by her own reflections on failure and childhood aspirations.  
"I wrote down the phrase, 'I should have been a detective', and the honesty of it made me smile. By rubbing on the page underneath I emulated the TV crime trick of rubbing a pencil over a smudge to reveal traces of vital clues. Enjoy the double act in the work— myself as confidante and as the detective revealing the thought."  
MFA 2006 graduate Tessa Lind earned a most prize for "The Ontogenesis of Thought", a multilayered meditation of a notebook created by well-known New Zealand artist Lisa Lye. Painting over a page out of a digital reproduction of the book, Tessa describes her work as a "copy of a copy of a copy", because Lye himself copied Maori and African forms, as well text from Sigmund Freud's Totem and Taboo.  
"As a fan of Lye's work, I am also aware of the problems of the use of other cultural material for inspiration, and the way in which we learn— and sometimes steal—from other cultures," says Tessa.  
Christina Read won a \$400 cash prize and will have a publication produced by the two galleries. The works of Christina and Tessa, along with half of the National Drawing Award entries are exhibited through 15 December at ARTSPACE (100 Karangahape Rd, Auckland). The other half of the entries are on display at The Physics Room (Second Floor, Old Central Post Office Building) December for shows running till 27 January.
