
1. INTRODUCTION AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

We are honored to present this Annual Report for *Agricultural Economics*, covering the first full year of operations under the journal's new editorial team from July 1st, 2007 through June 30th, 2008. Some highlights include:

- Submission of new manuscripts has risen to an all-time high of 293 manuscripts, from 185 received last year after the Gold Coast conference, and well above the all-time peak of 211 received after the Durban conference. We attribute this growth to our outreach efforts and the new web-based manuscript submission system, which is particularly useful for authors who are highly mobile or in developing countries where postal mail is problematic.
- Recruitment of new referees has been a major focus, through more intensive searching for reviewers with demonstrated expertise but no previous refereeing experience. In 2007-08, referee reports were received from 335 reviewers from 44 countries, up from last year's record of 243 reviewers from 36 countries.
- Speed of refereeing was kept on track during the transition, with the average lag between submission and initial editorial decision up slightly to 104 from last year's 100 days. This is somewhat longer than the 91-93 days achieved over the previous three years, which we attribute mainly to the larger number of less experienced reviewers.
- Acceptance rates are lower due to the larger volume of papers, relative to the 25% rate maintained during the 2000-2006 editorial period. Of the 557 submissions we received in the new editorial office, 10% have already been accepted and an additional 33% have been returned for revision or are awaiting referee reports.

- Our new data archive feature has been successfully implemented: for the three issues we have published so far, 19 of the 34 articles are accompanied by a zipped file with all of the data and code needed for other researchers to replicate their main results. Blackwell hosts the data archive online alongside the article and allows public access, unlike the article itself which requires a subscription. We are not requiring authors to make their data public in this way, and authors who make the data public are free to impose copyright restrictions on how the data are used. We believe that this approach to replication and transparency will continue to be extremely successful, and will soon be imitated by other journals.
- Publication through Blackwell has also improved with the introduction of "online early" publication and wider distribution of the electronic Table of Contents. We have not yet received Blackwell's 2007-08 production and marketing report but we believe that publication lags continue to be very short (under 60 days from article acceptance to publication) and that marketing efforts have been successful.
- Citation of our articles by others has remained high, with an average ISI impact factor of 0.603. This is up slightly from the level of 0.584 last year, and is well above the unusually low level of 0.382 seen in 2005. This places us at 6th of 9 ranked journals in agricultural economics, the same as last year.

We are very pleased to be serving the IAAE as editors of *Agricultural Economics*. We are grateful for the support of the IAAE Executive Committee, and for the help of our Associate Editors and Advisory Board. Above all, we would like to thank the 293 submitters who have entrusted us with their work, and the 335 reviewers who generously gave their time and attention to those papers.

2. THE EDITORIAL TEAM AND JOURNAL FINANCES

The journals' editorial team for 2007-2010 is listed in Appendix 1. This slate was announced last year, and differs from past approaches in that we have a small Advisory Board to look at the overall direction of the journal, and a larger set of Associate Editors to help with individual manuscripts.

The Advisory Board consists of seven prominent leaders in our discipline, representing a wide range of fields and institutions. The Associate Editors are 19 distinguished colleagues, with specializations in particular regions and methods. The institutional affiliations of our editorial team actually broadened during the year, as Prabhu Pingali moved from FAO to the Gates Foundation and Melinda Smale moved from IFPRI to Oxfam.

Book reviews have been ably handled by our new Book Review Editor, Harald Von Witzke. One future goal for this section is to obtain themed reviews that cover multiple books on a common topic, for example to help readers choose among alternative textbooks or to identify emerging trends among published books in a particularly field.

3. MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSIONS AND THE REVIEW PROCESS

Between July 1st, 2007 and June 30th, 2008, 293 new manuscripts were submitted to the Editorial Office, up from 185 the year before. In addition, 56 manuscripts had action pending from the previous year, and 64 manuscripts were received in revised form, for a total of 413 submissions handled during the year. The journal now handles an average of more than one manuscript per day.

Appendix 2 and 2a provide a detailed breakdown of each year's manuscript flow. Our new software allows a somewhat different and more detailed disaggregation than is available for previous years. Of all the manuscripts handled during the year, about 13% were accepted and 17% were returned for revision, and 18% are still with referees. Among completed decisions, the rejection rate is 62%. Of these rejections, about half are submissions returned to the authors directly by the editors ("summarily" rejected), and half occur after referee reviews are obtained. The appropriate use of such desk rejection is a very important aspect of effective journal management, to avoid wasting reviewers' time on papers that we know cannot be published.

Appendix 3 provides cumulative information on the status of all 557 submissions received since July 2006, relative to the 956 manuscripts received during the 2000-06 editorial period. Due to the larger volume of submissions and unchanged number of articles published, our rejection rate among completed decisions is now 83% relative to the earlier rate of 74%. These data cover a short time period, however, and 33% of all

manuscripts submitted to us still have action pending by either the authors or referees.

Appendix 4 and 4a breaks down the submitted manuscripts by country of origin. Our new software allows classification by the corresponding author only, which is preferable insofar as this counts each paper only once, under the country of the author who has primary responsibility for it. To facilitate comparison with past data on all authors, Appendix 4 includes a five-year total with percentages by country. These data are carried over to Appendix 4a, on which there are an additional six countries not previously represented. The absolute numbers are not directly comparable but the percentages can be compared. The fraction of all papers submitted from the U.S. is about 25%, down from 30% last year and in line with the historical average fraction of all authors; one surprise is the increasing level of submission from Iran, which is now the 4th leading country after Spain and Germany, followed by the UK, Australia, China, Japan and India.

Appendix 5 and 5a provides information on the length of the review process. Overall, average decision times are slightly longer now than in the past, at 104 days to a first decision relative to last year's 100 days and 91-93 days achieved over the previous three years. This could be due to using a larger number of less experienced referees, but could also be due to changes in the way these averages are calculated under the new system.

Our web-based manuscript handling software allows computation of much more detailed breakdowns than was possible in the past, emphasizing in particular the wide variance in time to a decision. For example, from the data in Appendix 5a, it turns out that of the 338 decisions that were made in 2007-08, the average time to a summary rejection was just a few days, whereas the average time to a rejection was 101 days, to a revise-and-resubmit decision was 144 days, and to final acceptance was 250 days.

Appendix 6 contains a list of all referees whose reviews were received between July 1, 2006 and June 30, 2007. On behalf of the authors and readers of *Agricultural Economics*, we are very grateful to these far-flung colleagues for their otherwise anonymous contributions to our discipline.

4. SPECIAL ISSUES, THE BLUE BOOK AND CLUSTER SUBMISSIONS

In 2007-08, we published a special double issue (Vol. 37 No. 2/3) containing a selection of the best contributed papers from the Gold Coast Conference, guest-edited by the contributed papers chairmen Ruerd Ruben and Kees Burger. In addition, our contract with Blackwell allows publication of one supplement per year, which was the Blue Book of program information and invited papers from the Gold Coast conference, edited by Kei Otsuka and Kaliappa Kalirajan. Note that papers published in

these issues are considered by ISI to be regular articles for the purpose of computing citation data.

For 2008-09, the supplement issue will include a number of manuscripts that came to us in "cluster" format, submitted together at the suggestion of a conference or project organizer. Each of these papers is reviewed independently but will be accompanied by a footnote indicating its origins as part of that particular project. For example, we recently processed a cluster of papers from a conference on agricultural R&D submitted together by David Schimmelpfennig, and currently have in review a cluster of papers on farm-nonfarm linkages organized by Tom Reardon.

A particularly important initiative for 2008 is a new cluster of papers on the causes, consequences and responses to the world food crisis. A significant number of high-quality papers on this topic are now being written. To attract them to our journal, we are offering fast-track review for all such papers submitted by August 22nd 2008, and are holding off publication of the 2008 supplement until the end of December to accommodate them. Our goal is ensure that scholars and policy-makers can use this as a timely and authoritative forum for the latest research on this important topic.

5. SPECIAL RECOGNITION FOR THE HIGHEST-QUALITY PAPERS

A promising initiative for this year is the introduction of an annual award for the best paper published in *Agricultural Economics* in each calendar year. The first such prize will be awarded at the IAAE meetings in Beijing, for the best article of 2008. All papers will be eligible and the award will be made at the discretion of the editors, but confidential recommendations are welcome at any time and a targeted request for suggestions will be made to all members of the editorial team (the Advisory Board as well as Associate Editors), the Executive Committee of the IAAE, and others at the end of the year. We expect to give a small plaque to the winners, and record their names on the websites of the IAAE and of the journal. We hope that a donor might eventually step forward to endow the award with a cash prize, although we believe that is not necessary for this kind of recognition to be effective.

6. JOURNAL FINANCES AND EDITORIAL OFFICE EXPENDITURES

For Appendix 7 and 7a provide a breakdown of revenue and expenditures for the journal's editorial office over the 2000-06 and 2006-08 periods. As expected, the adoption of web-based manuscript management software has sharply reduced our need for secretarial support; total expenditure is down from over 30,000 euros per year in 2001-2006, to under \$25,000 in today's devalued dollars. Appendix 7a includes a projection for 2008-09. Note that editors' travel to the Beijing meetings is not included in that projection, since it would fall under the 2009-10 fiscal year.

7. JOURNAL PUBLICATION AND MARKETING

We are now in the third year of our six-year agreement with Blackwell Publishers. So far they have provided excellent service in terms of both production and marketing. Blackwell's merger with Wiley has been handled well, with a smooth transition and a high-quality new website. Wiley continues to support the old URLs, including our most compact address which is www.blackwellpublishing.com/agec. We have also experienced a change of Publishing Manager, and now work with Matt Barsamian. Many thanks are due to the previous manager, Jon Gurstelle, for his abundant help to us during our first year. The other key personnel remain unchanged, and we continue to receive excellent support from the Production Manager, Adrian Redmond, and the Marketing Manager, Katie Gaines.

We have not yet received Blackwell's 2007-08 production and marketing report but we believe that publication lags continue to be very short (under 60 days from article acceptance to publication) and that marketing efforts have been successful. In 2006-07, the number of full-rate institutional subscriptions rose to 249 from 232 in 2005-06, (and 217 the year before that), with a further 934 institutions using electronic access, and total revenue from the journal increased by 14% from the previous year.

8. CITATIONS AND JOURNAL RANKING

In 2007, *Agricultural Economics'* ISI impact factor held steady at 0.603, up slightly from last year's level of 0.584, retaining our rank of 6th among the 9 ranked journals in agricultural economics. Appendix 8 provides the detailed data. We hope that our ranking improves over the years, thanks to higher visibility of the journal, more submissions and higher quality of the articles we publish, and the new data archive that facilitates replication. These changes and the other initiatives described above can increase citation rates, and make the journal more valuable in other ways as well. Our goal is not just citations, but to serve IAAEA members by offering an efficient, open and transparent marketplace for the best research in our discipline. We thank all those who have contributed to the journal this year, and look forward to continued collaboration in 2007-08.
