The programme consists of Chopin's Andante Spianato and Grande Polonaise, Beethoven's Sonata No. 30 in E major, Jacques Hétu's Impromptu, and Alborada del gracioso from Ravel's Miroirs.  
Born in Quebec City, André-Anne Perron-Fortin started her training at the Conservatoire de musique de Québec and also studied at McGill University with Richard Raymond where she obtained a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in performance with great honours: High Distinction, Outstanding Achievement in Piano Performance and Dean's Honour List. Other awards include Governor General's Medal in Quebec City, André-Anne Perron-Fortin.

Canada "Jeunes Artistes" Competition. She is currently a doctoral student in piano performance at the Cleveland Institute of Music with Dr. Daniel Shapiro.  
André-Anne Perron-Fortin made her orchestral debut at age 13. Some of her performances have been broadcast by Radio Canada and Radio Suisse-Romande. In recent summers, she has been invited to participate in several music festivals including the Banff Centre for the Arts, the Orford Arts Centre and the Académie de musique de Louanane, in Switzerland. In collaboration with violinist Vitrinque Mathieu she has performed at chamber music festivals across Canada. Upcoming performances include recitals - Rivière and Saint-

Pierreville. An advocate of new music, she recently premiered the piece Shards for piano and electronics by Canadian composer Christian Ledwith.  
The Aber Diamond Debut Series showcases talented young musicians from Canada and around the world. The recitals take place in the Foyer of the NAC at noon, and each will be broadcast across Canada on Eric Fricson's afternoon programme Studio Sparks on CBC Radio Two. Those listening at home can tune into the full three hours of Studio Sparks from noon
