It also delineates the major reasons for not using contraception and details policy and programme lessons. Based on information collected from currently married women between the reproductive ages of 15 and 49 years, the paper concludes that there is a clear need for improving access to and the quality of reproductive health and family planning services, together with the programmes that are more focused on unmet need.
