We show that throughout this period, despite evidence of convergence, the racial gap in attainment between blacks and whites has been persistently determined by the initial gap. We obtain these results with 2SLS estimates where slavery is used as an instrument for the gap. The excludability of slavery is preliminarily established by instrumenting it with the share of disembarked slaves from t Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade. Using the same approach we also find that income growth is negatively affected by the initial ra gap in education and that slavery affects growth indirectly through this channel.
