#### Two 2013 Hogg Prize Winners!

Due to the exceptional quality of two papers in the 2013 Hogg Prize Competition not one, but two Hogg Prize are awarded this year. The 2013 Richard M. Hogg Prize winners are (in alphabetical order): Axel Bohmann (Austin), "Nobody canna cross it: An interactional perspective on discourse in motion", and Elspeth Edelstein (Aberdeen) "Adverb climbing as evidence for the structure of non-finite complements in English." #### 2013 ISLE Referendum Results

Two items were decided during the 2013 referendum, taking place from 6 to 19 May 2013: 1) the host instit of ISLE-4, and 2) the period of time between each ISLE conference. Members decided upon Adam Mickiewic University in Poznan, Poland, to host ISLE-4. Members also decided to change from a triennial conference rh to a biennial rhythm, meaning that ISLE-4 will take place in 2016 (two years after ISLE-3, at the University Zurich), with successive conferences to be scheduled for each even numbered year following.
