In recent years, the University of Greenwich has seen that disabled students at Medway and plans to expand even further in the future.
The School of Health & Social Care is the biggest winner, with applications up 70% for courses in Nursing and Speech & Language Therapy, both offered in partnership with Canterbury Christ Church University. The most popular subjects are in the School of Science, which received 1000 applications, and the School of Engineering, which attracted 1270 applicants. Other subjects where there is a high level of demand include Business Administration, Health and Social Care, and the School of Education.
Ruslan Adzhikba, Director of Academic Planning for the University of Greenwich at Medway says: "I am delighted that the University of Greenwich at Medway has so many applications this year. We offer a combination of a quality education, a great campus and better tuition fees, which seems to be popular with school leavers and mature students.
"Furthermore, from this September, we will have more places than ever before, the result of our great continued investment in this campus.
"We are working closely with employers to make sure that our graduates have the skills that they will need to go on to get good jobs and help this region develop."
