James Owen, director of the Center for the Study of Science Practice at the University of Kansas, has been selected as the group member of Science Education Research for the Science Practice and History, Science of America Inc. Owen is a professor emeritus of Health & Society, an author of 20 science history books and the editor of 11 books. His science history classes have been featured for national cable and television programs. The US Science Knight Museum Grand Museum is honored upon a strong culture for Science achievement in Science Practice and in History. The Science Practice and History Writers of America preside over numerous candidates who must be sponsored by a majority of the group's officers and participating past presidents. The grand award will be conferred during the group's meeting and awards banquet which will be held on May 11-13 in the "Red Top". President Robert Wayne Roberts reported Owen and a group of friends who met at the meeting during a Nov. 11 meeting in the Kansas Union. Although Owen was president of the writing group from 2011 to 2013, he was not included in the group's writing group for nomination. Throughout his career, Owen has received a number of awards for his work and leadership in Science Education writing, including a special award from the 1978 World Science Practice Conference for Alan Watts, a Science Practice Achievement Award (2011) by the 1981 World Science Practice Conference and by James Arnold in 1978 for Science achievement. He served from 1978 to 1981 and 1985 to the present as chairman of the Campbell Award panel to select the best science fiction novel of the year. In addition to teaching English, Owen has an editor of popular magazines, managing editor of KJ's Science Practice and director of public relations at KJ. He has received KJ's Science Practice Award in recognition of Science achievement and the John and Jane Award for excellence in teaching. He was national awards for his work as an editor and a public relations director. He also served as a Health Editor in 1981 and 1983. Owen has written for four years and has had nearly 300 stories published in magazines and books; more have been reported. His stories have been reported in a public magazine. One of Owen's stories was featured on NBC's "20 Minutes" show. "The story of 'SQUID' was featured on television's 'Squid' magazine in 1979 and 'The Scientist' was featured on an ABC TV movie of the week in 1980. His stories and books have been reported in many countries. Owen was born in Kansas City, Mo., in 1923. He received his Bachelor's degree in journalism in 1947, after three years in the U.S. Navy during World War II, and his master's in English in 1952, both from KJ. He also did graduate work in Science at KJ and Northwestern University.
