Part A. GENERAL INFORMATION

An International Workshop on Tethvan Orogenesis and Metallogeny in Asia and Cooperation among Institutions of Higher Education (IWTOMA) will be held on October 12 -16, 2014 at China University of Geosciences (CUG), Wuhan, China. The workshop is sponsored by International Education College (CUG), Faculty of Earth Sciences (CUG), the State Key Laboratory of Geological Processes and Mineral Resources (Wuhan), and the State Key Laboratory of Continental Tectonics and Dynamics (Beijing). The 2014 IWTOMA will be held in the Conference Center situated on the beautiful campus of CUG. The Center provides an attractive and congenial setting for extensive communication among participants, with meeting meals taken at the Zhengdan Hall near the Conference Center.

The main purpose of this circular is to issue the "call for extended abstracts" - to invite experts to attend and give presentations in this international conference. The circular includes some additional information, such as Invited Keynote Speakers, Publications, Program Overview, Extended Abstracts, Delay Notification and Field Trip Route. Abstracts and Publications

Due to the summer vacation and suggestions by some scientists, the abstract deadline has been extended until 6 September 2014. Therefore, the organizing committee now continues to call for extended abstracts on late-breaking research results about Tethyan Orogenesis and Metallogeny in

Asia and Models for Improving Cooperation among Earth Science Institutions.

All papers should include a list of contributors and their affiliations, title, keywords and a text of no more than 4000 words (3-4 A4 pages). Figures (in jpg format), short tables (in Word format) and key references are allowed. For manuscript template for conference proceedings, please visit the IWTOMA website: http://www.iwtoma.org/

We plan to publish selected, original, high-quality, peer-reviewed papers in an international journal after the workshop closes. The choice of journal will be made based on the quality of papers submitted.

Registration and Excursion Fees

The registration fee covers the icebreaker, the daily morning and afternoon tea and coffee, materials, meals during the meeting, welcome banquet, insurance and accommodation. An extra charge will be added for the Pre-Conference and Post-Conference excursions. The Pre-Conference fee includes a one-day tour fee, bus fee, ticket fee and lunch. The Post-Conference fee includes a three-day tour fee, bus fee, ticket fee, accommodation and meal fee during the meeting.

Part E. POST-CONFERENCE EXCURSION

Plans are in progress for a 3-day, post-conference field excursion to the Three Gorges of Yangtze River, limited to 30 participants. The itinerary will take the group from the Wangjiawan North section to the Huanghuachang section (one night at Yichang city), then across western Hubei to the Daxiakou section in Daxiakou County (one night at Zigui city). The third day will focus on the Three Gorges area of the Yangtze River, and the group will be able to visit the Three Gorges. In this field trip, the group will focus on the Cryogenian-Ediacaran sections, two Global Stratotype Sections and Point (GSSP) for the Early-Middle Ordovician and the Hirnantian (Late Ordovician), together with a Permian-Triassic deep shelf facies section (Daxiakou section). Prof. Qinglai Feng (China) and Prof. Roger Mason (England) will be the trip leaders. More detailed information regarding the trip will be available in the guidebook now being prepared.

- Stop 1: The Wangjiawan North section the GSSP of Hirnantian
- Stop 2: The Huanghuachang section—the GSSP of Dapingian
- Stop 3: The Daxiakou section in Daxiakou County, western Hubei
- Stop 4: Cryogenian-Ediacaran stratigraphy of the Yangtze Gorges area
- Stop 5: Neoproterozoic granitoid rocks in the Three Gorges area.
