May 14, 2007. Nine University of Rochester students were selected to receive the prestigious Fulbright Scholarship—the highest number of University visitors in more than 30 years.

Students from the College of Arts, Sciences, and Engineering were selected to go to:

Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bulgaria, Chile, Costa Rica, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, United Kingdom, and Venezuela.

Over the last decade, about three to five students from the College and facul-

ties have succeeded in the annual Fulbright competition. In total, 27 undergraduate and graduate students in the College have been chosen as Fulbright Scholars since 2000 while seven Eastern students have won the prestigious honor.

The Fulbright Scholarship, which is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, is designed to promote mutual understanding and peace between the United States and other nations through educational and cultural exchange. Fulbright Scholars are given the opportunity to pursue career-

interests only, teaching, and research abroad. They design their own programs and arrange institutional affiliation in the host countries. Grants cover expenses such as travel and health insurance and provide a monthly stipend.

Rebecca Redden, director of International and Academic Advisor in the College Center for Academic Support, said that with the University's increased success in the Fulbright competition, Fulbright Scholars are inspiring and encouraging other students to apply for the award. For instance, about 10 years ago, the average number of applicants was fewer than five. That number has nearly quadrupled in the last few years.

"Given the nearly 35 percent of undergraduates who have studied abroad by the time they graduate, I know that we could significantly increase both the number of students applying for Fulbright as well as our success rate in the competition," Redden said. "I would apply for and winning Fulbright to become part of University students' academic experiences, and this is indeed what is happening."

Applying for a Fulbright is an extensive process that requires a project proposal, personal essay, language interview, and letters of recommendation. There is an interview and assessment at the University level by the College's Fulbright Committee, followed by a College of Liberal Arts and Sciences interview, and then there is a single national application due each year.
