A new exhibition at the Spencer Museum of Art at the University of Kansas offers a unique look at China through the eyes — and digital cameras — of KU students and faculty who traveled there this summer.

The opening of *Made in China: Observations and Understanding* will be from 6 to 8 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 7, at the museum as part of Student Night. There will be free refreshments, gallery conversations, activities, door prizes and music by KJHK deejays. The event is free and open to the public. Organized by design professors Pok.

Chi Lan and May Twiss, the exhibition features photographs and commentaries by KU students who traveled to China for a study abroad program. The students represented a variety of disciplines, including design, art, anthropology, political science, linguistics, architecture, history and art history. The exhibition installation diverges from a typical museum presentation. Rather than labeling each work and identifying the artists individually, the organizers clustered photographs together and affixed them to deep red walls with ordinary pushpins. Dozens of yellow tags with personal quotes revealing students' expertise will be on display in the museum's North Gallery until Feb. 4 and might travel to other venues around the state of Kansas. Students and former students exhibiting their photographs are listed below by hometown, level in school and major, parents' names (when available) and high school.
