OTTAWA — Puzzle Danse is a unique project uniting four adventurous choreographers from France and Quebec in an evening of four dynamic duets. Gaëtane Lauria (founding Artist/Director of Montréal's O Vertigo, known for "dance with a soul") and Étienne Clauzon (a soloist and choreographer who is a master of the theatrical gesture) represent Quebec; and Jean-Claude Gallotta (a sold-out favourite in his 2005 NAC appearance) and prize-winning Isora Makalukova (both from France) join forces to create an intriguing evening of dance.

Puzzle Danse had a successful tour of the Rhône-Alpes region of France in 2006 and will also tour nine cities in Quebec this winter. Puzzle Danse, in NAC co-production, will be performed in the Stades of the NAC on Thursday February 8, Friday February 9, and Saturday February 10, 2007 at 20:00.

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Puzzle Danse is a bold artistic exchange initiated in 2002 by Montréal's *O Verte* and the George des 20 Rhônes.

Alpes, a French collection of 22 municipal theatres. For this 2006-2007 edition, the producers invited four choreographers —

— Étienne Clauzon and Gaëtane Lauria from Quebec, and Jean-Claude Gallotta from France — to create four 20-minute shows for the NAC's Stades (theatre-in-the-round). Now, they have joined forces to create an evening of dance that will interpret the creative vision of these four artists, each one unique, yet linked to the others by a single creative impulse. In PUZZLE DANCE #2 by Étienne Clauzon — the fourth is a series of 24 studies based on the letters of the Greek alphabet —

the choreographer blends tragedy and melancholy in a work inspired by the Purus, Greek goddesses of vengeance. A man and a woman touch for the last time. They yearn for eternal bliss, but their meeting is fraught with the spectre of departure, haunted by the dread of separation, flight, violent parting. Will they tumble earthward, as Loris did? With an original score composed by Eric Pouge.

In JEAN-CLAUDE GALLOTTA'S PUZZLE DANCE #1 — the first — the choreographer has created a work that is a

clandestine meeting between two people who have been separated for years. Their meeting is a moment of intense joy, a

warm embrace and a kiss, the two bodies in love with each other. They sing at the top of their lungs, drunk with happiness. La vita è bella. Suddenly, tragedy —

and irony: the parting comes before the meeting. Who as original score composed by the choreographer in collaboration with pianist Amélie Steppich.

Les Petites Femmes by Gaëtane Lauria evokes the same sharp shards that separation embeds in the human heart. Disease, death, the decline of the body bring us face to face with our own mortality. In the distance, two women are waving: the farewell gesture of passengers aboard a ship. Someone is being left behind. Or is it the agonized plea of a drowning person? Les Petites Femmes explores that infinitesimal moment between life and loss of life, a feeling like p

Isora Makalukova's Assauts intérieurs takes place in the visiting room of a prison. Shadows and filth, bloodstains on the floor, scraps of paper, fragments of forgotten lives. A young man's terminal existence —

— solitude and condensation —

is heightened once a month by a woman's visit. They exchange personal histories. One hour of silence, sixty minutes of compassion: an encounter. But the woman leaves him, 12 times a year. With a soundscape by Jennifer McConachie.

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
