How Much Water Was Used for that Steak? - Adding a label to products that informs on how much water was used for the production is of great public interest, an international water conference has been told. It was during the Water Down Under Conference in Adelaide, Australia, that Economist James Hazelton argued that such disclosure would enable consumers to make informed choices about purchases. A label could also help to inform the public debate and provide an opportunity for industries to differentiate themselves while operating in a water-efficient way. Read more

Plans for New Dam in Africa - The World Energy Council has hosted a two-day meeting in London to discuss a plan to build the largest and most powerful hydroelectric dam in the world. The plant, that needs \$80bn in financing, would be situated in the Democratic Republic of Congo. It is hoped that it will boost Africa's electricity supply by a third, but opponents doubt it will help the poorest Africans without electricity. <u>Read more</u>

Governments are bound by human rights obligations to ensure water and sanitation. This was clearly indicated by a statement made by the UN Human Rights Council in Geneva last week.
