$27^{\mbox{th}}$ EGF General Meeting on "Sustainable Meat and Milk Production from Grasslands"

The 27th EGF General Meeting was held in Cork, Ireland, from 17-21 June 2018 at the Rochestown Park Hotel, Rochestown Rd, Douglas, Cork (Ireland) (see more on www.eqf2018.com).

The Conference on "Sustainable Meat and Milk Production from Grasslands" attracted a total of 430 participants from 31 different countries. More than 100 participants attended the Working Group 'Grazing' and Grazing Masterclass, about 60 the Working Group 'Sensing in grassland and forage science and practice', and 126 persons were registered for the workshop on 'Modelling relationships between plant diversity, the functioning of grassland systems and their ability to deliver ecosystem services'. The organisers were particularly happy about the participation of young scientists.

The 27th EGF General Meeting 2018 on a very current theme was professionally organised by the Irish team. The conference was a great success, scientifically, technically and socially.

16th EGF Symposium on Grassland farming and land management systems in mountainous regions

EGF2011 was a big success. More than 200 delegates from 30 different countries attended the 16th EGF symposium, which was held 28-31 August 2011 at AREC Raumberg-Gumpenstein, Austria.

Mountainous areas make up 30 % of Europeans total land area. Apart from forests, natural and managed grasslands are the dominating vegetation in these areas. In terms of the production function mountain grasslands are often characterised as disadvantaged land areas. But in terms of landscape and ecosystem services, mountainous grasslands are a valuable resource for society. However production as well as the other functions are threatened by the consequences of economic pressure on farmers, inadequate farm structure, globalisation of markets and processes like climate change, intensification and land abandonment.

${\bf 23^{rd}}$ EGF General Meeting on Grassland in a Changing World

The organisers of the 23rd EGF General Meeting and the German Grassland Society (AGGF) welcomed 400 participants at Kiel from 29 August to 2 September 2010. They made the EGF 2010 conference to all attendants a memorable event.

The mellow atmosphere of late summer provided a perfect environment for a successful arrangement and some of the most beautiful sites of Germany impressively presented themselves showing their diverse landscapes as well as variable forage crops.

Forage crops, covering more than 40 % of the agricultural land in Germany, play an important role in maintaining landscape biodiversity, besides being the backbone in feeding many domestic animals, e.g. cattle, sheep and horses. Only recently have they started to become a source for biogas production. Due to the increasing competition with alternative forage crops as e.g. maize produced for milk production, the share of permanent grassland is, however, decreasing in Germany. Thus, ecosystem services of permanent grassland beyond production functions play a dominant role in current discussions on the future of grassland and grassarable rotations are discussed intensively in order to develop sustainable forage production systems for milk production.

EGF2009:

15th EGF Symposium on Alternative Functions of Grassland

At the congress lasting from 7 to 9 September 2009 in Brno (Czech Republic) a wide range of issues concerning changes in the role of grassland especially with regard to the specific features of countries with a high proportion of arable land and a low proportion of grassland and with respect to the impact on some social and economic conditions of new member countries of the European Union (decrease in the number of ruminants and the level of animal production as a whole) were discussed. The discussion also included ideas about how to retain, maintain and utilise grassland in areas where its use for animal production will not be a top priority.

Czech Republic is one of the countries with a high share of arable land and low proportion of permanent grassland. But grassland is decreasingly used in animal production. This raises new questions and offers new alternatives in land use and utilisation of grassland biomass. The main goal of the Symposium therefore was to discuss several alternative functions of grassland: the importance of grassland as aesthetic landscape element and attractive space for recreation and sports activities, and the value of grasslands as source of bio energy. Also the methods for preserving different permanent grassland types were given attention.

The Symposium was organised by OSEVA PRO Ltd., Grassland Research Station Rožnov-Zubří (www.oseva.cz), Research Institute for Fodder Crops, Ltd., Troubsko (www.vupt.cz) under the auspices of the Minister of agriculture and in co-operation with the Czech Academy of Agricultural Sciences.
