



Pregnant women needed for midwifery studies (图)

14 March 2007, Pregnant women are needed to help UQ midwifery students with practical aspects of their studies.

Clinical lecturer/midwife for the new Bachelor of Midwifery program offered through UQ Ipswich, Peta Winters-Chang, said it was hop ed around 220 pregnant women could take part.

"Students need to establish a midwifery relationship with pregnant women, following their progress from the early stages of pregnanc y through to the weeks following birth," Ms Winters-Chang said.

"There are currently 22 students enrolled in the course, eight at Ipswich Hospital and 14 at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospita 1 (RBWH). As each student has to follow 10 women through their pregnancies, we need to recruit 220 women (80 from the Ipswich Hospita 1 and 140 from the RBWH).

"The students need to attend antenatal visits, the birth, and see the women postpartum."

"Women take part in relationship on a volunteer basis and do need to consent and sign a form to participate. They can withdraw at an y time if they wish," Ms Winters-Chang said.
