Kensall D. Reid and Polly Anderson Professor of Manufacturing Technology, Professor of Atmospheric, Oceanic, and Space Sciences, and Professor of Biomedical Engineering. He holds the 2007 Henry Russel Lectureship at the University of Michigan, is a Life Fellow of the IEEE, a Fellow of the AIMBE, and a member of the United States National Academy of Engineering.

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
