

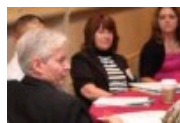
County Health Rankings

The County Health Rankings will be released on February 17, 2010. This study is the first to rank the overall health of counties in all 50 states - more than 3,000 total - by using a standard formula to measure how healthy people are and how long they live. The online report will include a snapshot of each county's overall health ranking within a state.

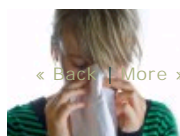
