A Message from Your Leaders


Dear Neuroscience Nursing Colleagues:



Key Accomplishments in 2007

Developed action steps to accomplish our four strategic goals:

1. Strengthen business performance of AANN
 - a. developed role for cofacilitator for Special Focus Groups (SFGs) as transition plan for leadership for SFGs
 - b. appointed four task forces to lead strategic initiatives: Retention and Recruitment, Business Performance, Products and Materials, and Affiliations/Partnerships
 - c. developed core values and requested members' input via a survey.
2. Establish the identity of AANN as the expert in neuroscience nursing
 - a. presented at the European Association of Neuroscience Nurses (EANN) conference in Iceland
 - b. appointed AANN representative to NeuroBlend: Susan Edwards, RN ADN
 - c. served as partner organization with the American College of Cardiology, American Heart Association, American Stroke Association, and others in the development of *Guidelines for the Management of Patients with Extracranial Carotid and Vertebral Artery Disease*.
3. Provide resources for nurses at all levels of practice that use multiple modalities and are available on demand
 - a. developed Clinical Practice Guidelines for AANN members: *Neurologic Assessment of the Older Adult: A Guide for Nurses; Guide to the Care of the Patient with Seizures, Second Edition; Care of the Patient with a Lumbar Drain, Second Edition; Cervical Spine Surgery: A Guide to Preoperative and Postoperative Patient Care*
 - b. supported continuing education (CE) opportunities for neuroscience nurses as a joint sponsor for the following:
 - (1) the American Association of Neurological Surgeons and Congress of Neurological Surgeons Section on Disorders of the Spine and Peripheral Nerves
 - (2) two educational sessions at the 2007 Congress of Neurosurgeons Annual Meeting
 - (3) The Parkinson's Disease Foundation's Frontiers of Science and Clinical Advances in Quality of Life symposium
 - (4) *PD Workbook: The Clinicians' and Nurses' Guide to Parkinson's Disease*, a free online educational offering in conjunction with WE MOVE.
 - c. increased the number of SFG-sponsored preconference workshops offered in conjunction with the annual educational meeting to include Stroke, Epilepsy, Neuro-Oncology, and Pediatrics.
4. Value the members of AANN by investing in their development

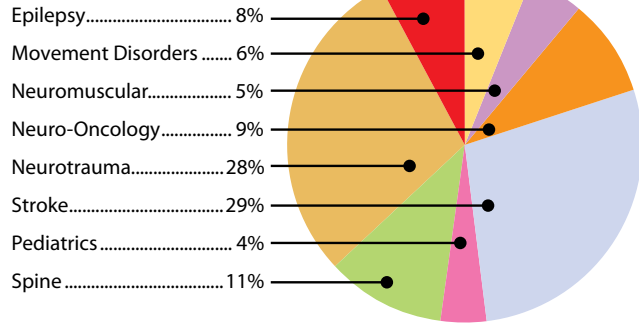
- a. provided 15,611 free online CE hours in May, the highest number in 4 years
- b. developed the Clinical Practice Guidelines Editorial Board. The board will work alongside Editor Hilaire Thompson, PhD ACNP BC CNRN.
- c. appointed Susan Carroll, MS RN CNE, as assistant editor of the *Journal of Neuroscience Nursing (JNN)*
- d. celebrated the annual Neuroscience Nurses Week, May 20–26
- e. hosted the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) reaccreditation site visit in December and submitted a full report to seek accreditation for 2008–2012
- f. donated historical AANN documents from 1968 to 1998 to the University of Virginia historical archives
- g. welcomed eight new chapters: Mid-South Chapter, North-East Florida, Oklahoma, South Carolina Upstate, Upstate New York, NY–Long Island, South Plains, and MoKan Blues
- h. continued to grow the number of chapter Web sites
 - i. increased membership 7% (268 members) to a total of 4,344 members
 - j. selected Baltimore as the site for the 42nd Annual Educational Meeting, March 20–23, 2010
- k. developed and distributed membership needs assessment.

- Susan Carroll will begin her role as editor-in-chief of *JNN*.
- AANN will develop virtual chapters.
- *APN Scope of Practice for Neurosurgery* will publish as a supplement to the October 2008 issue of *JNN*.
- AANN will publish the neuroscience protocols for nursing in partnership with the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses (AACN).

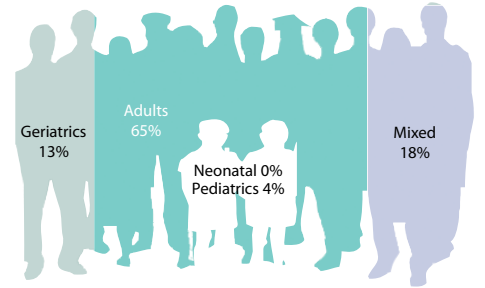
Clinical Focus of Members



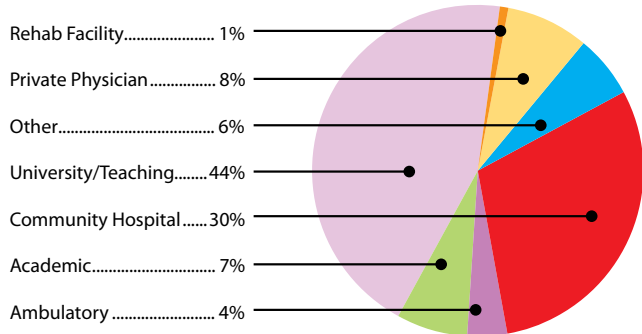
Years in Neuroscience Nursing

More than 15 years.....	.42%

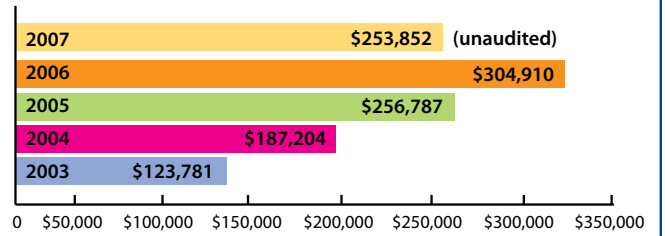
Primary Practice Population



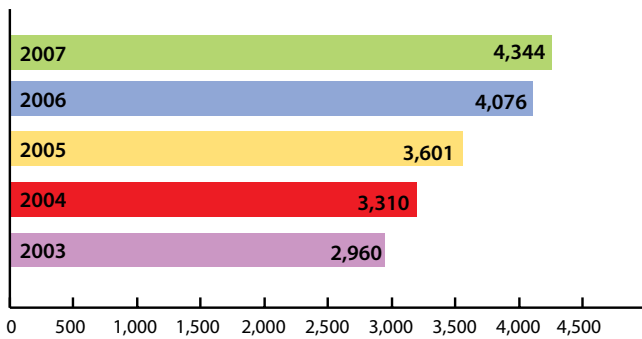
Practice Setting



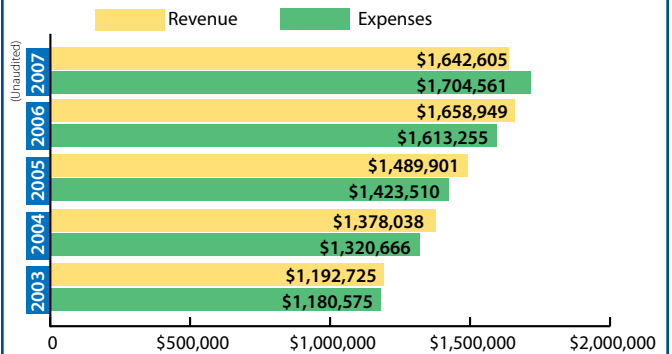
Net Assets



Membership History

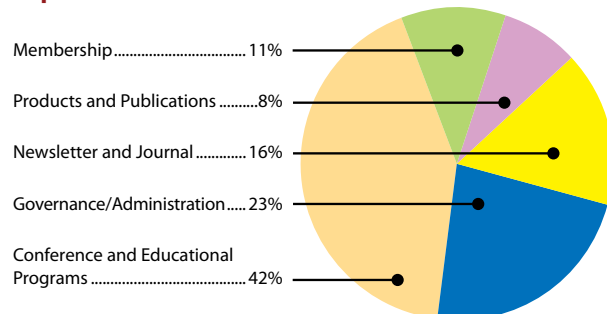


Historical Revenue and Expenses

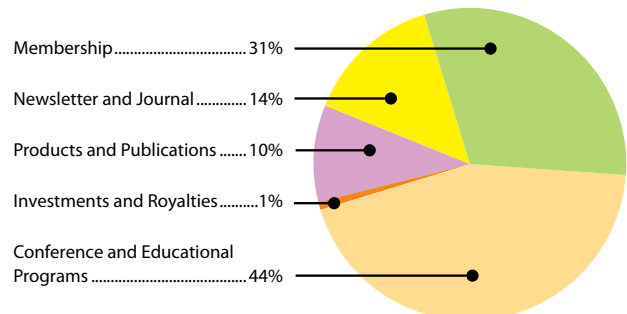


Current Year

Revenues





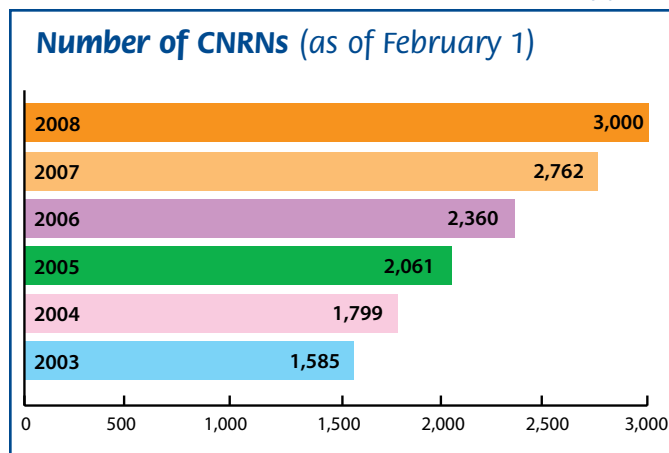

- Administered Certified Neuroscience Registered Nurse (CNRN) exam to 461 candidates
- Recorded the highest total number of certificants—3,114—following the Fall 2007 exam
- Awarded the Melanie Minton CNRN of the Year Award to Jacque Neatherlin, PhD RN CNRN
- Expanded the accessibility of the exam through implementation of computer-based testing option
- Achieved national reaccreditation by the American Board of Nursing Specialties (ABNS) for 2007–2012

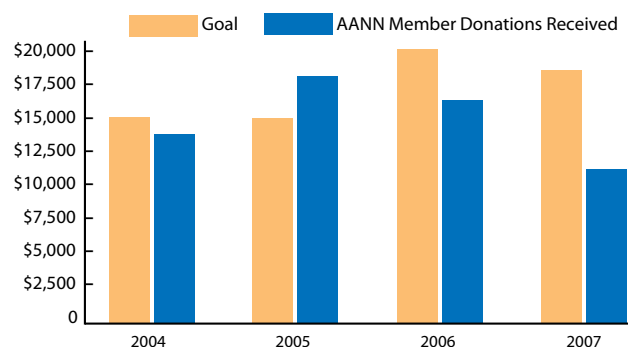
