### *New Databases*

“U.S. Presidential Debates since World War II.” Contains transcripts of nearly all primary and general-election debates in U.S. presidential elections since 1948. The transcripts, gathered from archives across the United States, allow analysis of position-taking on foreign and domestic issues.

“A Century of Expropriation.” Describes cases of expropriation of foreign direct investment since 1900. The data allow new research into the causes and effects of expropriation, including reputation spillovers from FDI expropriation to other areas of international relations. As of January 2012, the database contains all known twentieth-century cases of expropriation of U.S. firms.

“Commerce and the Law before World War II.” Contains data on commercial treaties and bilateral trade in the pre-GATT era. As of January 2012, the database includes MFN agreements, direction of trade, and national accounts for the years 1920–40.

“MIDipedia: An Expanded Database of Militarized Interstate Disputes” (with Jessica Weeks). Provides narratives, new variables, and complete documentation for the Militarized Interstate Dispute Database. As of January 2012, our research group has documented more than 1,200 disputes in the post-WWII era. Data are stored in an internet wiki that facilitates collaboration to improve the database.
